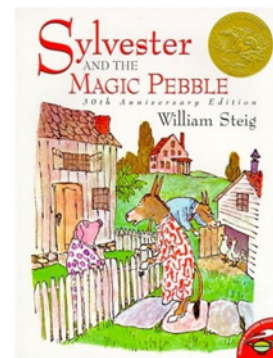
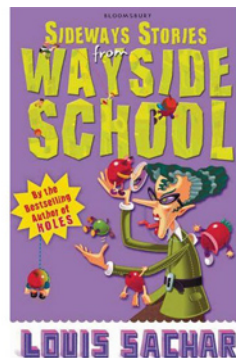
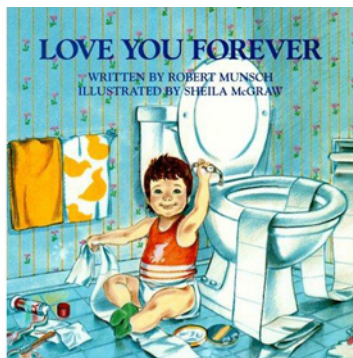
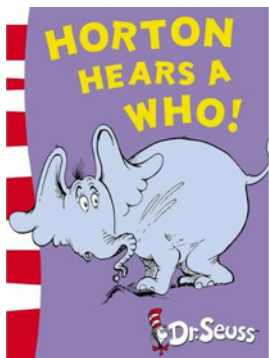


DALLAS CLAYTON'S TOP TEN LIST
